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Deep State and the Re-engineering of America Part I with Harry Blazer





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C. Austin Fitts: Ladies and gentlemen, this is Catherine Austin Fitts and Harry Blazer. Welcome, Harry.

Harry Blazer: Hello, madam.

Fitts: We are here to talk about the Deep State and the Re-engineering of America. As you know from listening to The Solari Report over the last year, I am very concerned about the plan underway to proceed with radical reengineering of US governance management, the US government, the US budget. And one of the terms that keeps coming up in that discussion is: The Deep State.

What I have discovered in the process is that there is tremendous misunderstanding about who and what the Deep State is. So I invited Harry Blazer to join me in what is likely going to be a series of conversations about what we know about the Deep State and who and what they are and why we care about them; because I think the better that you can understand the Deep State and how that operation works, the easier it will be for you to navigate your way through the kinds of reengineering's that are happening now and will happen – particularly after the Presidential election.



Is there anything that you want to say about why you are doing this, other than the fact that I made you do it?

Blazer: You know that one of the ways that we met was because when I sold my business, I wanted to understand about the ‘real deal’. A big part of that and a very important starting place, for me, was the Kennedy assassination. To me, that was the official story that didn’t make sense, and I wanted to understand what really went on and how close I could get to understanding that.

I came across what to me was one of the most important books that actually also frames what the Deep State is about.

Fitts: Right, and I agree with you. We are talking about Retired Colonel Fletcher Prouty.

Blazer: The two books are *The Secret Team* and *JFK: The CIA, Vietnam, and the Plot to Assassinate John F. Kennedy*.

Fitts: He also has a lot of interviews available. So what I will say is that Fletcher Prouty not only provided us with incredible understanding of the Kennedy assassination and other major events, but as he did it, he did a great deal to understand the nuts and bolts of how an operational capacity threads through many different organizations – but particularly the US government - which we refer to as ‘the Deep State’ – and how they function. He understands what it is, how they function, and who it is.

He has got a lot of knowledge that helps you understand the Deep State.



Blazer: That is why I brought him up. Today if you said, “How is the Deep State operating today when it comes to Syria?” or some other event today, you would be a little bit harder pressed – although you could do it by extrapolation – to say exactly how. But because there has been so much research and because of who Prouty was and the position that he was in and the visibility that he had and what he actually participated in, he has told you, “This is what actually happened.”

He actually tells you, “This is how the U2 flight failed,” or, “This is why Kennedy was killed.”

Fitts: We are going to go through Prouty, and then we are going to come back to some of the other sources and examples that will really help you to understand the Deep State. Then we are going to back up and talk about the bigger picture and where the Deep State fits in. We are going to get much higher in the governance structure.

Let’s start with Prouty. You take it from here, Harry. Where do you want to start?

Blazer: As an addendum to this, I am going to do a bit of an audiobook where I am going to read some quotes from his book – word for word – so you get a real understanding that this guy doesn’t pull any punches and the understanding that he has.

At that point, I will go into detail about his credentials. Just suffice to say that he was one of the guys who didn’t sign a non-disclosure agreement, and for many years he was basically the guy who was responsible for supporting all of the clandestine activities that the CIA did in the world for a period of time – from the mid 1950’s to the 1960’s.



Fitts: Was he CIA or DOD?

Blazer: He was a military person with the rank of Colonel in the Air Force who did operations for the CIA and was responsible for supporting all of the clandestine operations.

Fitts: I'll never forget the first time I saw someone who was in the military – on the payroll. He was also on the CIA, and he was also in the mafia. So basically he was working for three organizations at the same time.

Blazer: One of the questions that I asked was, “What was the relationship of the *Secret Team* and the Deep State?”

What we are going to find out is that they are quite synonymous in terms of the way that he uses the term. He would constantly say that there was this guy who might have been a general or a colonel who had the uniform of the military who was actually on the payroll of the CIA, and the military didn't care because they were paying for him and they provided the cover.

The FBI provides this kind of cover, and other organizations provide this type of cover for clandestine operatives that are not just operating outside of this country, but within the country.

One of the very important things that we need to make clear – and we might as well do this right off the bat – is that the secret state is not the government bureaucracy.

Fitts: Although there will be people on the payroll who are part of it.



Blazer: They know how to work the bureaucracy, and they are oftentimes in very big positions within the bureaucracy. One of the ways that he describes it, and he gives very specific examples, is that a guy comes in as an assistant to somebody. He is there to keep the CIA informed about what is going on and maybe to give some input to see if he can get a few buttons pushed.

Time goes by, and the guy who was leading the department who is a political appointee goes away. Somebody else comes in. He gets advanced because somebody else leaves and so on. Before you know it, he is like the second in command in this organization, and they never knew that he was a CIA guy. The guys who were running it didn't know that he was CIA because he had always been with the organization.

Fitts: Throughout the governmental positions in bureaucracy you have a whole stream – and Prouty describes this at one point – of deputies (sometimes assistant deputies), and then counsels. A lot of it is run through the budget with the deputies and through attorney client privilege through the counsels. They are very much a part of the Deep State, but they are peppered through – just like they are peppered through in the media.

Blazer: They are peppered through in the media to basically control the disinformation campaign which he goes into in detail. Across the room from his office was the 'control and deception' department. They have major inroads into academia, so they get the guys with the big credentials to say, "Yes, this is the way that it is," and write their reports. They are also in the 'think tanks'.



Anybody who has the sense that there isn't great competence involved, that there isn't great planning, that there isn't long-term planning, Prouty will dispel that myth. That is a very important part of one of the things that makes it difficult for people to understand how all of this is possible.

When he tells you that he is there when the decision is made at the end of World War II, and right at the end of World War II, to send the equipment that was stockpiled for the invasion of Japan to support a 500,000-man invasion of Japan, then splits up all of that equipment. Half of the equipment is sent to Korea, and half of it is sent to Vietnam – or what was thought of as Vietnam at that time. That was in 1945.

The Marines are officially deployed in 1965 in Vietnam, and the Korean War didn't happen until five or six years from that. There is huge planning, and a big part of the planning is: How do we keep conflicts going for the benefit of money being generated for the large military-industrial complex, which is not a myth.

Eisenhower talked about it. One of the reasons why Eisenhower talked about it is because he got burned.

Fitts: He got burned badly.

Blazer: Just like Kennedy got burned by the Bay of Pigs, let me tell you one of the ways that Eisenhower got burned in a major way that Prouty has very intimate knowledge of and goes into quite a bit of detail in the books about it, but also in further interviews. It's around the Gary Powers U2 flight.



So here is this thing that was shot out of the sky. Even today they will tell you that it was shot out of the sky, and they show you the wreckage. So what actually happened?

Fitts: And they captured the pilot.

Blazer: Right. It was shot down from this high altitude of 70,000 feet or whatever it is, and he is captured all in one piece. We know that he is a military agent because of the identification that he has on him and all of this other stuff.

So how did the U2 thing actually work? Well, there were three planes that sat on the tarmac. There were three pilots. They were in U2's, and lots of nations ran U2's. Sometimes they would use pilots from other nations to run U2's for the United States so that they could have deniability, which is a key prerequisite for any covert operation. You can't trace it back to the US or whatever country is doing it.

So they had three planes sitting there and three pilots. Before the pilots even get dressed, they strip. There is a doctor who looks at their naked body to make sure that they don't have anything on them at all that could be any source of identification. They put on uniforms with cloth that is made not in the United States but from some other country so that even the suit cannot be attributed to the United States – never mind the planes and what they go through in taking out any marks or identification or anything that could be traced back to even a manufacturer in the United States and this type of stuff.



So the U2 was a plane that was capable of flying well above 70,000 feet. He doesn't specifically say, but it is quite clear that it could go up to at least 90,000 feet. It had this remarkable camera that they developed, and that was the real beauty of this thing; it took amazing photographs with amazing detail. That was a very important part of technology that they had, and they wanted to protect it.

So here are the pilots. They are stripped, and they look to make sure that there is no identification. They then put the pilots into the planes, and then they move them. So the pilots have no idea what plane they are going to fly, and they have no idea which pilot is going to fly that day.

Those are the extremes that they went through to make sure that there was no way that there could be anything that could be smuggled on the plane or placed on the plane that could identify these guys with the United States.

So when Gary Powers is found – and you also need to know that his plane was not 'shot down' – Prouty took a picture of the wreckage that Khrushchev puts out, and he showed it to Johnson from Lockheed, who eventually ran the Lockheed Skunkworks. He said, "Is this is the U2 wreck?"

He said, "No. That has nothing to do with U2 wreckage." Second of all, this would have disintegrated. These things are incredibly light, and it's more like a glider. It doesn't even have landing gear; there is just one little wheel on the nose. It crash-lands (on its belly) every time it lands.



So he said, “No, that’s just a wreckage - a pile of junk - that they had in different places and they put together.”

Fitts: Right, but they had Gary Powers.

Blazer: Yes, but Khrushchev wanted the world to think that they had the capability of knocking down a plane at 70,000 feet above – which they didn’t.

So what actually happened? That’s just an effort of Khrushchev making a heyday out of it. Also, how did all of this identification – his driver’s license, his PX card, and rings that he had that he was going to bribe women with to get out of the country in case he got captured, and all this type of thing – get in the plane?

When you see stuff like that, what Prouty is telling you is that that is the *Secret Team* at work. That is the Deep State at work.

Fitts: Right. Gary Powers was set up, the plane was set up so that it would run out of hydrogen, so it would have to land, and he would have to parachute out.

Blazer: Actually he didn’t parachute out, but that is basically it. You are getting a little bit ahead of the storyline. It’s very instructive when you have somebody who is able to give you this level of detail. This tells you how an op works. Not only that, but there is a whole mechanism to support the op totally outside of even the traditional CIA mechanism and outside of the military mechanism that is there to support it. It’s a whole other deep inside mechanism with the ability to totally change world events because the significance of the U2 flights was this: It derailed detente between Russia and the United States.



Eisenhower was getting to be very good buddies with Khrushchev. They were trusting each other, and there were huge amounts of groundwork laid.

Fitts: He ordered no U2 flights before he met with Khrushchev.

Blazer: They actually sat down as teams of Russians and Americans to figure out anything that was going on between the two of them that could derail the peace process and eliminate that possibility. The U2 flights was one of them. So Eisenhower instructed that there would be no flyovers.

They also stopped covert operations in Tibet because Prouty's team was supporting the Tibetan liberation fighters with food, medicine, and ammunition, and they stopped that.

He was so upset by that that he went to the Secretary of Defense and said to him, "You can't stop this. My guys are going to get killed on the ground. They are fighting for their survival."

"No. We can't have anything happening at all that could be misinterpreted or interfere with this peace process that is going to basically end the Cold War."

Fitts: So Powers' flight was an overruling by the *Secret Team* of the President's orders.

Blazer: The guys who ran the U2 who were in an office two doors down from Prouty. The next day when this happened he asked them, "What's going on?" It's bedlam.



They didn't even know that they had a flight going on. So somebody gave the okay to these pilots who were on the ground to go and take off and do this mission (that contravened Eisenhower's orders). In the meantime, somebody at that base put all of this information into the plane - in the parachute I believe - that tied Powers to the US military so that Khrushchev could come connect the plane to the U.S.

They came out first with, "It's a NASA plane and they are doing weather research." Then five or six days later Khrushchev said, "No, we have all of the identification. It's a military operation."

Fitts: The reason why I wanted to bring this up is because we just saw this happen again. Trump was going to meet with Putin at G20, and suddenly this crazy Ukraine thing happened, and Trump was forced to cancel the meeting with Putin.

Blazer: Right. So you and I would immediately go, "That is a *Secret Team* operation that is happening separately to derail this meeting."

What I am telling you is that that is exactly what happens. It happens all of the time. It is outside of any governmental process that technically is supposed to be in place. Oftentimes it is outside of even the intelligence agencies.

Fitts: The line management in the executive branch is often out of the know. When the *Secret Team* moves, it may use people in those infrastructures, but the decision-making and some of the operations – all of the operations – are often outside.



Blazer: Not only that, but they may use the bureaucracy – either members of the bureaucracy or bureaucracy itself – and they are just doing their job that they always do. They don't know how that is related to this other thing. Very few people do.

So how did the U2 flight end up on the ground? Well, it requires hydrogen among other things to allow it to burn the jet fuel that it has at the very high altitude. Without that hydrogen, the engines flame out.

The canister that contained the hydrogen that Prouty's team provides as part of the military support for these types of covert missions was half-filled. He's not sure himself who had it half-filled. It was the longest flight that a U2 ever went on, and it basically went down halfway through the flight – exactly where they wanted it to.

So here is this thing at 90,000 feet or 100,000 feet or whatever it is, and Gary is flying it. All of a sudden, the engines stop. Here it comes down and down until finally it comes to a level where the MiGs would come up and stop it: "Here is this thing coming down. Now we can go intercept it."

One guy who was in a train said in another interview that I saw, "The sky was filled with MiGs. I was wondering what was going on."

Here they are following this thing, and eventually Gary just landed the U2 in a field.

Fitts: So he didn't parachute.



Blazer: He didn't crash; he landed it. The wreckage would never look like that. If it was shot down, it would have been 'disintegrated' (that is the word that they used), and Gary would have died. So he actually landed it in a field. He stepped out, and he was captured with all of this information.

Fitts: And he gets on TV that the Russians have captured him.

Blazer: Right. He is totally dumbfounded by, "Where did all of this information come out about me? I didn't put it in. I don't have it. How did it get on the plane?"

You know that super-duper camera that I told you about that was in the U2 plane? Well, this one that went down with Gary Powers standing next to it didn't have that super-duper camera in it; it had an older version from a bomber that wasn't high-tech. So somebody must have understood that that plane was going to come down, and they wanted to protect that technology and at the same time disrupt what was going on between Eisenhower and Khrushchev. The meeting basically fizzled.

Fitts: I am reminded of one of my favorite videos that we had in our 'Top Videos'. It was a video of Chuck Schumer, who I can say nothing nice about except for this video, where he talks about the 'new President, Trump' on Fox News right after he won the election. He said, "The President can't defy the CIA. He has to do what he is told. They have 50 ways from Sunday to get you. He will learn."

What he was saying there was that the CIA runs the government, not the President.



Blazer: There is a very significant link which I am going to have, and that was a very significant quote. Schumer is a good example of a guy who is part of the *Secret Team*.

Fitts: He is obedient.

Blazer: He is like a McGeorge Bundy – although not quite as high as McGeorge Bundy was – who totally undermined Kennedy.

Fitts: I would describe him as a *Secret Team* ‘attack poodle’.

Blazer: There you go! That’s a good one. And it’s not only what he said, but it’s the smirk that he has on his face. It’s very clear that he is delivering a message to Trump that says, “The CIA is pissed off at you for what you are doing. You can’t screw with them.”

Fitts: “You had better go kiss the ring!”

Blazer: They have so many ways to mess with you that you can’t even believe it. Schumer is describing how the *Secret Team* functions within the government.

Fitts: I just want to take a minute and talk about one of my great frustrations in life. When someone I know tells me, “Oh, we really want you to go work in government and help Trump,” it makes me realize that they haven’t really heard what I’m saying.

Blazer: Why is it? This is important.



Fitts: The President is surrounded by a group of Secret Service agents. Are their guns pointed outward to make sure that the President is protected, or are the guns pointed inward to make sure that the President does what the *Secret Team* tells him to do?

Blazer: We know with the JFK assassination that it was pointed inward. I'm not saying that the Secret Service shot Kennedy literally, but they created all of the conditions where the assassination with the coup by multiple teams of people could be executed.

Fitts: Right. They slowed down for the gunshot, among other things.

Blazer: Among many other things.

The Zapruder film has been doctored. That is very clear. But one of the things that it does show you is how they slowed down in the 'kill zone'.

Fitts: The reason the government bureaucracy is not implementing the wishes of the people is not because they are incompetent, not because it's too hard, not because they don't know how to do it, but because that's not how the system works.

Blazer: Basically the government is constantly being either manipulated, intimidated, or undermined or used to fulfill the desires of the secret government. The covert world is in charge. They are in charge.

Fitts: Right, because they can kill with impunity, and they do.



Blazer: They have unlimited funds, they have incredible amounts of talent, they've got compartmentalization that absolutely makes it impossible – except for very few people – to actually have a clear picture of everything.

Fitts: They have technology way beyond what we can fathom exists.

Blazer: Absolutely, and they have all of the data in the world to look at.

Fitts: And here is the best part: Every person listening to this Solari Report is pouring money into their pockets. We are all financing them. We are all paying taxes which finances them, we are all supporting the Federal Credit which finances them, and if you look at our banks, our insurance companies, our pension funds, and our retirement savings, we are buying all of their securities when, in fact, their operations are run illegally.

Blazer: Basically we have subsidized the Fourth Reich. You can show very definitively how the CIA was structured and organized very much with the direct advice from guys like Gehlen who ran the Secret Service of Germany and other people who were brought over on Operation Paperclip. These guys helped design the organizational structure and the operational rules and guidelines of the intelligence agencies.

Fitts: Let me step back for a second. One of the books that I always recommend to people is *Trading with the Enemy* by Charles Higham. What it showed was that there was coordination above ———



— the Presidential level during World War II. You literally saw a President's orders overruled so that a ball bearing factory in Ohio could keep providing the Third Reich with what it needed to keep the tanks going.

You had a 'metastructure' coordinating keeping the war going and using resources on both. So part of the reason why Dulles is so important is because he was sitting in Switzerland the whole time laundering money back and forth so that IBM could run the holocaust databases.

There is Edwin Black's wonderful book, *IBM and the Holocaust*. Between Higham's book and the *IBM* book you get a clear picture that there is a metastructure above both governments, and it is doing a variety of things and laundering money and resources back and forth – in part to keep the war going.

At the end of World War II you had 75,000 Nazis basically brought into America. That is a huge number of people. Operation Paperclip was a big operation. We talk about the Deep State peppering through all of these different organizations and bureaucracies, and those Nazis get peppered all across the place, and their money gets brought into and laundered – including through the Vatican – into a whole series of places in Latin America, Europe, and the United States. Basically the whole Nazi infrastructure is just merged in, if you will.

Blazer: Not only was it merged, but basically they were advising on how to structure our intelligence agencies, keep them secret, and keep them compartmentalized so that they could function in the same way and as effectively as the German's secret state did.



You've mentioned a number of very significant things in what you just said. Prouty doesn't pull any punches. It's not a coincidence that guys like Smedley Butler, the most decorated Marine General ever, ends up writing a book that says that 'war is a racket'.

These guys understand that one of the main missions of the Deep State (the *Secret Team*) is to foment conflict to keep the war machine going. One of the problems after World War II was not even so much the atom bomb, but the hydrogen bomb ended war, as we knew it up to that time.

Fitts: But they believed that they needed war for economic reasons.

Blazer: It changed the kinds of wars that could be fought in the future. It was going to become basically a counter-insurgency world.

The Cold War was planned. Prouty tells you that, and he even shows you the operations that were being done in 1944 to basically foment the Cold War. Now we've just replaced the word 'communist' – which was the catch phrase which allowed you to do anything you wanted to in the "fun and games" world and to finance it and be secret about it – with the word 'terrorist'. That's all they had to do to keep it going.

So this idea of, "God, how stupid these guys are to have done Vietnam!" No, you don't understand. The goal of Vietnam was to have a war extend for ten or 15 or 20 years that brought hundreds of billions of dollars into the war machine. That was it. So it was a very successful operation, and it was run by the CIA right up until 1965, when the Marines were deployed. And the Marines were not going to be deployed as long as the CIA was in charge. That is what the heads of the Marines said.



Fitts: Let me step back. One of the reasons why I sometimes have trouble communicating is because I find myself talking to people who have lived in the overt world, and they look at the management and governance structure as whatever they've been taught in civics classes or whatever they read in the *Wall Street Journal* whereas I look at pots of money and risk and everything being organized around the transactional and management flow as to what is happening and where things are going.

It's a totally different way of looking at the world because you have to look at the world as a financial and economic ecosystem. Part of where they go is where it's logical to go given where the money is now. It's not enough to understand the people and what their goals are; you have to look at what the economics are.

I just want to mention a few things. If you look at the machinery that they have created to finance secret worlds, it's quite phenomenal. It's the most amazing financial accomplishment in the history of the world.

Blazer: And Prouty goes into some detail in terms of the operational side of that. He will tell you that even the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff was constantly surprised when he found out, "The money is going for that? These weapons that we lent you guys went for that? You have how many warehouses throughout the world with all this equipment in it?"

That is where it goes back to Daniel Inouye who was running the investigation about Iran-Contra. Part of the link is going to be his quote at the end – his last speech –



– where he talks about the intelligence agency, particularly the CIA, having, their own air force, navy, and the ability to support it. They can launch the wars anywhere in the world, and they can do what they want basically. This is from the guy who was investigating it.

Fitts: We are essentially talking about infinite amounts of money for private armies. So when World War II was over, they passed the 1947 and the 1949 Act. The 1947 Act creates the National Security State, and the 1949 Act creates the CIA. So the big trouble in this phase starts there. What that does is it gives them the ability to claw money out of any Federal agency.

You appropriate to Congress, that appropriates to HUD \$100 million, and they claw \$15 million back for the CIA.

Blazer: I think that there was some later legislation – not too much after that time – that actually defined how those mechanisms could work. In other words, they legitimized the secret funding of these organizations by law.

Fitts: Here is the power: So we know that there is Constitutional Requirements and legal requirements and lots of financial management law that we have written about and published that describes the fact that they have to report their accounts. However, in 1981 when Bush took control of the National Security State, that was basically his deal with Reagan. When he took control, they promulgated an executive order signed by the President that private corporations could do highly classified acts. To me, that is the magic moment.



When you add 1947 and 1949 with this, and with the fact that the government does not provide transparent accounts – including to Congress – and you establish that the government can run financially outside of the law, and using the reserve currency status borrow an infinite amount of money and turn it over to private corporations to build assets that private corporations own, think of how hard CEOs work to get their earnings up \$0.10 so that they have a good quarterly report.

You are taking this rapacious model in the stock market, and you are giving it access to an infinite amount of money on a nontransparent basis to do whatever this group wants. How is that going to work?

Blazer: I have two things that are very important to add to what you are saying: Seventy percent of the intelligence budget goes to private corporations and private contractors.

Fitts: And that is only what they admit to today.

Blazer: Never mind the black part of the black budget. The second thing is: Corporations give another layer of insulation because of the corporate veil.

Fitts: The secrecy is engineered through the corporations.

Blazer: The third thing is that huge amounts of wealth have been created by folks who specialize in sucking up the subsidies that government provides. These subsidies that we are talking about are 70% of this money that is going to corporations from the intelligence budget.



Fitts: Here is the magic sauce that happens after World War II: You take the extraordinary flow of money that you can create running the government on a secret, out of control basis using the Federal credit, Treasury securities, and dollars all over the world, and you combine that with the leverage of controlling the Exchange Stabilization Fund and the securities markets. So now we are talking about stealing a dollar, but with financial leverage that the Federal-credit-now-stock-market-derivatives being able to turn every dollar into \$200 to \$2,000. Now you've got a machinery that can buy the world.

Blazer: Prouty will tell you about businesses that were subsidized that were competing directly with unsubsidized regular businesses – guys just trying to run businesses. Here is a CIA-funded business front that is involved with laundering money that is operating a legitimate business that is competing with you with a cost of capital that is way below it.

Fitts: Their cost of capital is so much lower. That is why we keep seeing the mediocre win. The mediocre are winning because they are not winning based on the business or the product or the service; they are winning because their cost of capital is so much lower that they can buy everybody and they can spread the money around.

We have played this game globally. While everybody is saying, “Their weapons are terrible. They are really inefficient. They are overstaffed,” they don't see it because they don't see how the cost of capital is driving the win.



Blazer: Also they are in the business of raising money by selling drugs. So they have lots of these other illegal activities that they are involved in that have been given legal status, even sometimes by the courts. They have the right to do it and hide it.

Fitts: Let's get back to Prouty. I couldn't figure out narcotics trafficking until I read *The Secret Team*. *The Secret Team* documents how they use attorney-client privilege. If you read the RJR Nabisco documents on that lawsuit by the European Union who is competing for the market share and you read Prouty, what you realize is, "Oh, they have an entire parallel infrastructure in the law firms and in the government bureaucracy that can operate and launder all of this between attorney-client privilege."

I was convinced that HUD and the mortgage markets were laundering a huge amount of the narcotics trafficking that the CIA and the Department of Justice were clearly doing. They were doing it through government accounts, and they could do it because you have this whole parallel universe of Deep State people peppered through. If they are not Deep State people, they are just people with a control file created by the Deep State.

Blazer: Every now and then because of certain pivotal events we get a glimpse into the mechanisms. So what are they? You've got the 1947 and the 1949 legislation that you can go read and see how they established these organizations and also how they decided to fund them – basically the ability for criminality that is built into the legislation. Then you get things like the Bay of Pigs. There is enough written about that, so you can say, "Okay, what went wrong there?"



We can go into detail on that. That is another thing that was sabotaged, and it was not at all what the press said happened.

Then you've got the Kennedy assassination. You understand that now as an op because there has been so much good research done by people. They have had 50 to 60 years to do the research.

Then you get Vietnam War. There is enough information out about the Vietnam War that you can start to put together, "Oh, that is how the *Secret Team* works."

You've got the Iran-Contra, the Church Committee before that, and these are glimpses that you get. Then to a certain extent, the other major pivotal event is 9/11 which we don't have lots of visibility of, but we have plenty of research that has been done to know that it is basically an op. It's not the op as represented by the conspiracy theory that is represented by the government; it is something that is very different.

Fitts: I want to step back for a second and talk about 'who'. One of the reasons I am very comfortable talking about the Deep State and the *Secret Teams* is because they trained me; I grew up with them. I was around them.

As you know, my attorneys asked me to record six ninety-minute cassettes of working at HUD. So I took my personal experience of working with and bumping into the Deep State at HUD, and then I went out and I researched. I said, "Oh, that's what that was. Oh, that's what that was."



So I'm trying to take what I know anecdotally or from personal experience and then match it up with serious research. That is where my understanding comes from. For me, it's a reality because I understand that the world is run from the covert side.

So let me get into 'who'. One of the things that first happened to me when I started to dive into this research, I signed up for the CIA drug list. It was a Listserv where they were discussing narcotics trafficking by the intelligence agencies.

The first thing that I discovered was that there were three groups. One said, "It's the Vatican. It's all the Vatican. It's a giant global conspiracy run by the Vatican."

The next group said, "It's all the Masons. It's a giant, global conspiracy run by the Masons. The Masons area to blame."

Then the third group said, "It's the Jews. It's the Zionists."

One of the interesting things is when I was a kid in Philadelphia, you had all three of those groups competing and cooperating. The power of the relative groups have changed. You and I talk about why we think the Vatican's power is as low as it has been since World War II, and the Masons and the Jews have teamed up and have ascended.

One of the things that I want to talk about is that all three of those groups clearly have massive resources and power, but it's not just one. There is no magic bullet. And now we have to add, "It's the aliens," or, "It's the interdimensional forces."



Blazer: In the final preface to Prouty's *The Secret Team* book says:

They can use the finest intelligence system in the world, and most importantly, they have been able to operate under the canopy of an assumed, ever-present enemy called 'Communism'. It will be interesting to see what 'enemy' develops in the years ahead. It appears that UFOs and aliens are being primed to fulfill that role for the future.

Of course, there was a step of 'terrorism' in between, which the secretary of Wernher von Braun said, "Yes, first it's the communists. Then it's the terrorists. Then it's going to be the aliens."

So when you make comments like this, people need to listen. That's all I can tell you.

Fitts: To me, the question behind all of this is: Who really does run this?

The Deep State, aka 'the *Secret Team*', is the operational capacity. Then there is still a secret governance system. We know Wall Street and the money is clearly very important. So the owners of the New York Fed and the Fed member banks and that ownership structure is very, very powerful. I would argue that it is still more powerful than the military intelligence, but clearly the intelligence operates on their behalf. That has been my experience, and I don't see anything that has changed.



Blazer: The way that we would say it, and Prouty is very, very clear that he also believes that this is the case, is that there is a board of directors. The CIA works for ‘the *Secret Team*’, and the *Secret Team* works for the board of directors. That is basically how he puts it. But it’s not just Prouty; Buckminster Fuller says it, Benjamin Disraeli says it, Winston Churchill says it, and I’m going to have links to the 25 or 30 people over the last 150 years who have claimed that there is a board of directors. People call it the ‘high cabal’ and different things.

Fitts: You see Dolan and Daniel Liszt both do stories recently on James Forrestal and his death. Forrestal’s death is very interesting. You basically have the *Secret Team* take out the Secretary of Defense and then kill him. It’s quite remarkable to watch how they do it. You see the kind of extraordinary capacity that they had in the Gary Powers U2 incident.

Blazer: They derailed détente and the possibility for the Cold War ending in order for us to have peace during the Eisenhower Administration, which was what he wanted to be his utmost legacy. Then he does his little ‘Let me tell you about the military-industrial complex’ speech on the way out, which I always thought was a bit hypocritical because he was involved with the military for so long. But now I understand.

Fitts: Eisenhower got the space program moved to a civilian agency. If you’ve ever watched *Sputnik Fever*, it is one of my favorite documentaries because it shows him standing up and beating the shriek-o-meter. It is one of the few examples you will see in history of the US history beating the shriek-o-meter.



Blazer: By ‘beating’ you mean that he won over the shriek-o-meter. What was the shriek-o-meter saying?

Fitts: The shriek-o-meter was saying that we needed to turn this capacity over to the military and dramatically increase expenses because they had satellites first. It was a lot of scare tactics.

Blazer: By the same token, the *Secret Team* has figured out – regardless of what that end result was – of how to use NASA or any private corporations to do their bidding. You could say that it’s even more hidden now than it might have been.

Fitts: But the shriek-o-meter is controlled by the *Secret Team*. Absolutely.

Blazer: Yes. They push things the way that they want for sure.

Fitts: Correct. In fact, think of the shriek-o-meter as a sheepdog that is herding the President and the executive branch and Congress to do what they want. I can have a control file on you, but if I don’t have a control file then I just turn the shriek-o-meter on.

Blazer: But what is also true is what you are not going to hear about. That is just as significant.

Fitts: One of my favorite Eisenhower stories, which I believe is true, is that one of his greatest mistakes was that the CIA was not supposed to be operational. One of the most interesting things that you can get from Prouty is how it immediately turned into an operational agency – both domestic and foreign, not just intelligence gathering.



Blazer: And it wasn't even supposed to gather intelligence; it was supposed to coordinate the gathering of the intelligence and come up with the analysis. Then it went from coordination, to collection, which became a primary front 'for the fun and games' as Prouty maintains.

Fitts: Right, but here is the worst part: He put them in charge of security for Area 51. Between that and the hidden system of finance created by the seizures after World War II he turned the CIA into the most powerful bank in the world. That is truly frightening.

So he had authorized them to do security on Area 51. Suddenly they stonewalled him; he wasn't getting briefed. So he called them and demanded that they come in for a briefing, and they wouldn't. They were basically defying the President. He called them up and said that he was going to fly to Colorado, get the First Army, and invade Area 51 unless they are in his office the next day to brief him.

What is interesting is that Eisenhower truly had leadership capacity, and the military would do what he said. He was admired, he was respected, and he was followed by the military. After Eisenhower, there was no President who could command that loyalty. We know that the military stood down at Dallas – which leads us to the Kennedy Assassination.

After Prouty, reading and understanding the Kennedy Assassination is the single-most important thing that you can do to really see the Deep State.

Blazer: Dulles basically stacked the deck, hoping that Kennedy would get in over Nixon, which was kind of bizarre because they felt that they could control Kennedy more.



Fitts: The felt that they could control Kennedy better than Nixon.

Blazer: Right, because he wasn't as sophisticated. He was young, and his father was in organized crime.

Fitts: But he was in pain.

Blazer: Then what they found out was that he was a little bit smarter than what they expected, and also he was a little bit more principled than what they expected. Robert was a real pain in the ass. Having both of them there was a major problem.

What Prouty comes out and says is that these guys didn't have a chance against the entrenched powers when they came in. When he finally decided to pass the national security advisement that said that all American personnel were going to get out of Vietnam by 1965 and he was basically committed to winding down the war, that was his death warrant.

So there is a constant theme that comes up. Anybody who is working for peace and gets close and has the power to make it happen is going to be prevented from making that happen.

Fitts: I think that there are a couple of issues. There is a model. Anybody who tries to change the model is a problem. The model is: 1) Running a war economy. 2) Letting the banks and the *Secret Team* control the reserve currency. The governance structure of the *Secret Team* controls the central banks.



Blazer: In other words, Kennedy basically tried to short-circuit many, many third rails: the Federal Reserve Bank, because he was starting to have the Secretary of the Treasury do what he was supposed to do and issue real US money. He also went against US Steel. He went against the oil guys by trying to get rid of the oil depletion allowance. He went against the military and basically stopped the Vietnam War. He went against the major intelligence agency, the CIA, that was running the show by firing the top three guys and calling them on Bay of Pigs. He also took away the ability for the CIA – through another national security advisement document – so that the military was now going to be in charge of all covert operations, not the CIA which had weaseled its way in over time to be in charge of it.

Kennedy did so many things that disrupted, not only the military contracts that he had awarded to certain companies (that the military guys didn't want to go to those companies) because that would give the Kennedy's the most political leverage in these districts, but he touched almost every third rail that there was, trying to short-circuit it.

All that I am saying is that from Prouty's perspective, when Kennedy said, "We are getting out of Vietnam," that was his death warrant. That was the way that he described it.

Fitts: I would probably disagree with Prouty there because I think that it was a couple of things across the model. We talked about currency, we talked about war, and I would also say secrecy. Kennedy was looking to make the world a much less secret place, and the *Secret Team's* power very much depends on secrecy.



Blazer: Prouty's whole thesis is that secrecy is a disease that has cost us huge amounts of personal capital, money capital, all sorts of resources, and it is a disease that is absolutely destroying democracy and turning it into a fascist state.

Fitts: I will tell you that in my opinion, the minute that the general leadership – the establishment in Washington – accepted the Federal Accounting Standards Board policy, this is the equivalent of announcing, “We are going to be a fascist dictatorship.”

Blazer: The Patriot Act was also a step.

Fitts: That was a major step.

Blazer: So we can take a look at legislation continually that shreds the Constitution, that gives incredible amounts of power to centralized government, that gives tremendous amount of facilitation to more and more secrecy, that makes criminals out of the people who are trying to expose the criminality and protects the criminals, and it has been this constant move-forward.

Fitts: Right, but where we are as an economic model is that you are saying to the citizens, “You have to buy our bonds, and you have to pay our taxes, and we can take all of that money and just give it to private banks and corporations and give you a piece of paper back which you are liable for, and there is nothing that you can do. Whatever we are doing down here, it's none of your business.”

Blazer: We are subsidizing our own enslavement – which you have talked about many times.



Fitts: It's not just subsidizing; we are giving. Now with California and the fires we know that we are watching weather warfare and thermal warfare going on against law-abiding Americans.

Now they are just taking your land, and it's not even a pump and dump on the stock market or a pump and dump of the housing market; we are just coming in and firebombing you and taking your land. That is where this is going.

Blazer: The point of Prouty is: Here is a guy who had the ability to know, who came clean about a lot of stuff, and he is telling you that there is a huge amount of planning, that there are incredible amounts of competence, that they have everything that they need to basically fulfill their agenda, and they work for a group of guys who are outside of the government. They are extra-government and extra-legal, and they have the ability to kill, and they do it constantly as one of their many weapons that they have. These guys are basically the main power. They are changing the world and directing the world in ways that the Constitutional process has no power over, and they are alive and well and getting stronger. Prouty wrote this in the 1990's.

Unless we figure out a way to defund these guys and disconnect and disrupt this mechanism, democracy cannot survive. These are the messages that Prouty is delivering, and he is giving you very precise details about very specific operations and very significant, life-changing, world-changing situations that were orchestrated by the *Secret Team* that changed our life on this planet forever. He tells us how it was done and why it was done.



Fitts: One of the things that I often hear is, “The problem is that the American leadership is incompetent.”

I just finished reading Tucker Carlson’s new book, and it’s really delightful. He is basically saying that the problem is that the establishment is incompetent. The fear porn that makes me so angry basically says, “The empire is incompetent, but it’s powerful and it’s running its out. Then it is going to fail. After the collapse, things will all go back to normal. We will all have a very difficult period to live through, but they will fail.”

It has a vision of these guys as incompetent. There are plenty of incompetent people because the way that they run it is sloppy – intentionally if you are playing the ‘cost of capital’ game. But my experience with the A-team from 30 years ago until today is that they are amazingly competent.

Blazer: There are two very important things here: There is very detailed strategic planning by very intelligent people, and they are very competent people within the framework doing the operations that are extremely complicated.

The Kennedy assassination was clever.

Fitts: It was amazing.

Blazer: To bring down the U2 when the President is saying, “You can’t do it,” and to be able to bypass that and figure out the technical ways and all of the innards to get that canister delivered to that plane so that it is going to drop out halfway through, all that is tough. It is very clever.



Fitts: Let me just say on 9/11 that when globalization began and I was travelling around the United States, one of the things that I noticed was that they were significantly rebuilding and reengineering all of the airports so that they would significantly increase the retail shop capacity. They were turning all of the airports into malls.

This was in 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998. I kept thinking, “This is an enormous investment of capital and planning. How are they going to make this infrastructure pay for itself?”

Then 9/11 happened, and I thought, “Oh, this is how they were going to make the infrastructure.”

You had to be building out the infrastructure to change the airports ten years before 9/11 happened.

Blazer: You also talk about slop. There is a lot of slop, and some of it is intentional, but part of what Prouty says is that it is a product of the way that the *Secret Team* works because what he talks about is almost like this cybernetic machine that responds to inputs automatically. So you have lots of people around the world who have a certain amount of autonomy, a lot of capability, and machinery to do stuff. They report to headquarters, “We are hearing that the communists are going to do this here,” or, “The terrorists are doing this here Do we have permission (to act)?”

“Yeah, sure. Go ahead. We’ve got all of the money in the world. Go ahead and do your thing.”



So you've got lots of people who are oftentimes doing things who don't know that the other guys are doing something, and they are working against what they are doing, and it conflicts with what the military is doing. So you've got that kind of a slop.

But major operations like Vietnam or Iraq are orchestrated. And they are prosecuted often under false pretenses. So 9-11 happens. Then we immediately identify this entity called Al Qaeda as the culprit – and in turn, we target Osama bin Laden, who is supposed to be the leader of Al Qaeda. Then we use terrorism as a pretext to invade Afghanistan, to get at the Taliban – that is not Al Qaeda - and as a pretext to invade Iraq to get rid of Saddam Hussein, who was the foremost archenemy of Al Qaeda in the world. So we are going to attack the Taliban and eliminate Saddam Hussein as a result of Al Qaeda being the architects of 9/11?!!

It makes no sense on the surface, but it makes total internal sense when you take a look at what the goal is. The goal is to have controlled chaos throughout the Middle East so that you can basically control the resources, and you can have an ongoing source of conflict and war. You want controlled chaos, which is one of the major strategies that the CIA implements around the world.

Fitts: Although I've never quite understood their strategy in the Middle East relative to the globe. You sink tremendous resources into one thing while you ignore things that are important elsewhere. It's almost as though you want the United States to diminish in power intentionally.



Blazer: There may be that, too. But in terms of just taking a look at, “We want to create the maximum amount of chaos that is controllable that will generate the maximum amount of money for the various constituencies that are involved with fighting terrorism”, you couldn’t have done it better.

You do what you are doing in Syria, you get rid of Gaddafi – who was keeping a huge number of these factions under control – and you get rid of Saddam Hussein who was doing it also, and you form a war between Iraq and Iran for years so that you get the whole Shiite thing going against the Sunni faction.

Those are indications not of incompetency; they are indications of a detailed, strategic plan.

Fitts: You talked about Prouty’s books. I think that the best book after Prouty on the JFK assassination is David Talbot’s book, *The Devil’s Chessboard*.

Blazer: So there are three: *Mary’s Mosaic* by Peter Janney, *JFK and the Unspeakable* by James Douglass, and David Talbot’s *The Devil’s Chessboard*. Those are the three best.

Fitts: I have one great ally who is extremely intelligent. I got him to read *The Devil’s Chessboard*, and I should just say that *The Devil’s Chessboard* is a biography of Dulles. You really don’t get the 411 on the assassination until you read the last two chapters and it ties it all together. It’s remarkable. You see a lot about how the *Secret Team* works.



It was either in Janney or in *The Devil's Chessboard* where the mafia daughter is explaining how the best way to hit somebody is to get them in for elective surgery, and they just happen to die. There are all of these great factoids about how the system works.

What Talbot does is he really helps you understand how the project management and the coordination with the upstairs and all of the money guys is done. It's very carefully done, and it's very subtle, but he absolutely nails the story. It's quite a remarkable book.

So anyway, I gave this book to my friend. He called me and said, "I just feel very much dropped from a seesaw about this."

I said, "You already know that that the establishment killed Kennedy."

He said, "It's one thing to know it, and it's another to see the details of how it really happened."

It's a paradigm-shifting experience if you read those three books. We know in the Peter Janney book that Peter Janney came to believe that his dad was involved for the CIA in implementing the assassination, and he goes to a description as he is writing this book of it dawning on him that his own father was involved as part of the kill team.

It's almost as though we as a nation or we as people have to go through the realization. To me it's a *Rosemary's Baby* moment. "This is really happening, and I'm involved." It's not something in Washington and Wall Street. If you look at how it threads through my life, my money, my balance sheet, my financial statement, my work, my company, I am involved.



Blazer: So the important messages are: The covert world is the most powerful force. The Deep State/*Secret Team* is alive and well, and it is shaping our lives much more than any other process. This whole idea of incompetency and complexity is a cover. That provides the obfuscation.

So the real question is: Is it too late? This thing is so entrenched and so pervasive and so well-financed. Now it's so turbo-charged by technology. How do you disconnect it?

Fitts: I want to get to that question, but I want to dive in and hit a couple of points before we get there just to flush them out.

I think that one of the most amazing things that happened – and a lot of this is post-Prouty – that really turbo-charged the *Secret Team* was the creation of the NSA and the use of digital technology and AI to do digital surveillance. You are creating the capacity at a very economic basis to basically put 24/7 Stasi teams (on everyone) because you can use software bots; you don't need humans. So you are talking about complete surveillance, and now even entrainment and mind control of 325 million people.

I've done a couple of interviews with people who call themselves 'targeted individuals' because they are targeted for electronic harassment. I've said to them, "Get over your victim thing because there are 325 million targeted individuals in America, and I would add more in other countries. They divide between two groups of people: Those who know that they are targeted, and those who don't."



Blazer: The electronic harassment is a whole different level of targeting, but we are all surveilled and we are all targeted to be harvested and influenced.

Fitts: Right. It's kind of an extraordinary infrastructure once you understand it. The rise and expansion of the NSA and the role of data turned over to private corporations, just as the Treasury has become a way to launder all of the money as a gift into private corporations who now own the technology. What we are watching is the NSA as a laundry mechanism to launder all of the data on the planet into private corporations.

So I want to get back to this question because there is a Zionist issue and there is a Vatican issue and there is a Freemason group. These groups exist, and they are an issue. One of the things that we have said is: We think that the power of the Vatican is at an all-time low. Maybe you want to say a few words on that.

Blazer: No, you keep going.

Fitts: I believe that the Vatican absolutely got trumped when the Freemasons, with the help of the Zionists, built the digital surveillance structure. Why the Vatican got left flat-footed I'm not sure, but from what I can see, if you look at the creation and management of the control file system – including with pedophilia – the Vatican has taken 100% of the blame, and that was a joint venture. How did they wake up and take 100% of the blame? They just keep taking it. What is that about? I don't get it.



The other thing is that there is a serious problem. We just saw Australia debate and reject, “No double passports. No double citizenry for anybody in a senior political government position, including their legislators.”

We now have a significant number of people in Congress and in the line of bureaucracy who are dual citizens, including dual citizens of Israel. It is a very serious problem. We even had the head of the FBI before Mueller stand up and say that the biggest threat to national security in America was Israel.

Harry is being very quiet.

Blazer: Take a look at the size of that country, and they have an incredible amount of influence. There are two ways that that comes: One is money. The main boulevard in Tel Aviv is named after Rothschild. The second thing is having something on everyone. So they have really, really good intelligence.

There is a third part of that which I believe is that the Israelis have been very active in helping to support our *Secret Team*, and they are part of the *Secret Team*.

Fitts: For example, at the end of World War II, William Stevenson points out that the deal that Americans made with the Brits is that they would both listen on the telephone systems, and then the Brits would get the data and give it to us. That is how we got around the laws. It’s very interesting the way it’s done.



From what I've seen during Iran-Contra, the Mossad was doing a lot of the dirty tricks for the *Secret Team*, and they could basically say, "Oh, it's those guys." They were willing to operationalize and handle so much of that that they very much earned a promotion in the system.

Blazer: Prouty goes into a lot of effort to talk about how much money is spent supporting our friends and allies overseas, but also compensating people who get pissed off because we've compensated someone else, "and we didn't get any?" So you have to even the playing field.

When something gets dropped off in Columbia because they had to ditch it, you have Guatemala coming back and the other Latin American countries saying, "They got this. You need to give it to us, too."

Fitts: The Midianite-type fighting is one of their biggest dangers and one of their biggest risks.

Let's talk about America today. In this commentary we recommended *JFK* by Oliver Stone as the movie because it has so much insight into the Kennedy assassination.

Blazer: Also Donald Sutherland is basically a composite of Prouty.

Fitts: Up until that point, it is unbelievably instructive about how the world really works. If I had to pick one to help you understand currently, it would have been *Eyes Wide Shut* because you literally see this level way above the government that has powers approaching magic. It's that powerful.



During the litigation I dealt with invisible man technology. I am absolutely convinced that they have it just from what I saw.

Bring us up to the current level.

Blazer: I think that we should go back because just like going into depth about the U2 incident is very significant, I think that we need to do it with the Kennedy assassination.

Fitts: Let's do that right now.

Blazer: We don't have time. We need to come back and do it with Iran-Contra because these are very, very pivotal events.

Fitts: Iran-Contra is very helpful.

Blazer: We can come back and do it with 9/11 because 9/11 is basically the context for all of the stuff that happens after that in terms of the shredding of the Constitution, the gigantic move towards fascism, the collection of data, the ability to collect the data, and a whole other level of secrecy. It's not just what you talked about with Congress saying, "It's okay now for the government under the guise of secrecy to not be accountable financially," but they have passed lots of other things that say, "If we say that it's secret, you can't talk to your lawyer about this."

Fitts: They just implemented a policy which is unconstitutional, and they are acting like somehow through the Federal Accounting Standards Board, it has the ability to tear up the Constitution and tear up the financial management laws and ignore Congress.



Blazer: All I am saying is that that is happening on multiple levels. And 9/11 enabled that. So that is why it is very important to look at that.

All that I am saying is that you and I can look at these instances when they happen, and we say, “This is the Deep State.” People are still struggling with that in 2018 – even people who are very intelligent people who we know who should know better.

Fitts: I want to talk about the memory wipe. In my experience, the way that you really come to understand and come to see the Deep State is you see them do something, and then time goes by. Then you see them do another thing, and time goes by. Then you see them do another thing, and you start to accumulate knowledge.

One of the phenomena that I’ve seen is people seeing them, saying, “It looks like there is a Deep State,” and then they forget. It’s a memory wipe. It’s one of the reasons why I don’t have a TV. I don’t want the memory wipe.

There is an inability to recapture and maintain history independent of the official story and the official reality.

The *Secret Team* is moving very, very fast. They are moving very, very fast on bringing capacity back into the United States and reshoring the National Security State. They are moving very, very fast on high IQ immigration. They are moving very, very fast on robotics and AI. They are moving very, very fast on space. They are moving fast on all of these things.



In other words, it's almost as though they have said, "Financial coup is over. We are ready to take the money and go to the next step, and we are free to rock-n-roll because we've got all these things sorted out."

They are going up the s-curve in a whole variety of different ways, and their attitude is, "We don't need you guys anymore. We're just doing, so get out of the way."

This is why the California fires keep having a really profound impact. One of the questions for them that they proved on 9/11 is that the mind control is really working. In 9/11 we had this effort to get all of the cell towers up. I had a friend who was a project manager for one of the tower companies, and for two years before 9/11 he was telling me, "The pressure that we are getting and the urgency and the speed is unbelievable. It's so brutal."

In the meantime, because I'm driving all over the United States, one of the things that I can tell you is that the cell towers don't work for your cell phone.

Blazer: What I'm advising is this: Sometimes it's hard for the subscribers to make the leaps that you and I do. I've been trained on this for 20 years with your help.

I think it's important to go at these pivotal events where we now have a lot of information about, that shows the inner workings of it so that people will be convinced. This thing is real. The Deep State is real. It's insidious.



Fitts: I'm not talking about the fact that it's real; I'm talking about the fact that there is something right now that people need to pay attention to. I want people to know what happened in 2001.

August 2001 a project manager called me and said, "You're not going to believe this. They've laid it all out, and they said it's done."

I said, "Uh-oh. Something big is going to happen."

9/11 required much greater control, not just entrainment technology and subliminal programming, but using the NSA surveillance to intervene and manage 325 million Americans one at a time. I think that they satisfied themselves that it was very successful. The more confident that they get that it's successful – whether it's their reengineering of the financial system or their reengineering of the media or the mind control – the faster they can go.

To me, what we just saw happen in Paradise is the result of what they did in Santa Rosa, and they were able to get away with it. As a result of that, they are doubling down.

If you look at the *double-down* from what I would call thermal gentrification into thermal genocide, now we are talking about "free-range Nazi ovens". This is really scary. If they believe that they got away free and clear with that, I don't know what is next. I don't know how fast they could move.



We are literally talking about being in a whole new phase, and that is why it is so important right now that people understand that there is a Deep State and it is free to do relatively whatever it wants, and it is proceeding to do it. It's not waiting for eminent domain.

Blazer: We are probably getting near the end of people's attention span and time, but when people say, "Trump is trying to drain the swamp," do you believe that?

Fitts: I don't think that Trump has the power to do it.

Blazer: But is that his intention? Would he like to?

Fitts: I think that to a certain extent, yes, he would. I think that he is concerned that the model that the Bushes and the Clintons were running was not going to succeed, and America was in real danger.

The swamp that Trump is going to drain is the people who are no longer necessary on the financial coup who are now overly expensive and not useful. He's not talking about draining the *Secret Team* or the Deep State.

Blazer: You keep bringing up this thing about 'piratization'. That is basically taking public assets and turning them into private assets as another way of harvesting. We are in a final stage of that, and Trump may actually be facilitating that to some extent – whether willingly or unwillingly.



Fitts: We knew one of the Cabinet Secretaries at HHS or VA resigned and said that they were looking at doing privatization, which is frightening. That is a very bad idea. He was warning people that they were in the bowels of the VA figuring out how to do all of this.

Blazer: The point is that you have got a businessman who comes in with the idea that business can probably handle government better to begin with, and he may be a key facilitator in helping transition more and more core government functions to private businesses and corporations with him being a cheerleader. So he might actually be either an unintentional participant in helping the *Secret Team* do more of exactly what they want to do because more of that means that they can operate more secretly all the time.

Fitts: Exactly. I've always believed that part of the Q-Anon op was getting the crowd ginned up to attack and kill the people who now need to be laid off from the establishment, which is good for the *Secret Team*. You are basically training people to be your coliseum audience as you get rid of the ones you don't need anymore.

Blazer: So they are pretty clever. They aren't incompetent, are they? They figured out a way for us to pay for our own enslavement, and then they figured out a way to make people into attack dogs to attack the people they want us to attack. They also figured out a way to have Facebook and Google and these other guys collect all of the data in the world with us willingly giving it to them.



Fitts: I think that they are very good at finance, and I think that they are very good at mind control. I think that they have within the Deep State operational teams that are quite capable and extraordinary. If you look at who they are and where they are going, I don't agree. One of the reasons why I stepped out is because I think they are going to fail. I don't agree with where they are going and what they are doing and how they are doing it.

The problem is that they may have information that I don't have. So maybe what they are doing makes sense, but I think that there are deep failures and flaws despite all of their capacity and capability.

One of the things that I want to bring up, which we are not going to go into today, is the Breakaway Civilization. You and I have talked, and we both think that the Deep State reports to a secret governance structure, and the Breakaway Civilization is a portion of that Deep State that is broken away, but it's still a subsidiary of the governance structure.

Blazer: The way that we have described it is: The Deep State is the operational arm of the *High Cabal* for the planet, and the Breakaway Civilization is for off-planet.

Fitts: Right. I guess Prouty calls it the 'high cabal'. I call it 'Mr. Global'. Is that fair to say?



Blazer: Yes. Just like ‘*Secret Team*’ refers to ‘Deep State’, there is enough that is analogous that basically you are describing the same type of people. It goes beyond sovereignty of people, of nations, and it basically has more power than nations or nations combined to affect behavior on this planet. That is what you are describing.

Fitts: If you look at America, the US government is basically a laundry to suck up the money for a transnational power that runs what is going on here.

Blazer: I warned you that any time that we go here and make these types of statements, people are going to think, “That brings into doubt everything else that you are saying.” That is why I wanted to build a foundation with these various events, and I hope that we can come back and do that. “Let’s tell you what we really know now about how this stuff was done and how the *Secret Teams* worked,” and so on.

Fitts: You know how hard it is for me to talk within the official reality. You’re asking someone who was trained to deal at a very high learning metabolism to step back and go at a learning metabolism that ensures that we fail. That is very hard.

Blazer: Yes, but you have intimate knowledge and you have also spent a lot of time training yourself in acquiring additional knowledge besides what you know, and the favor that the government did to you by personally persecuting you for years and having to deal with it. So you know firsthand.

You’re in a little different place, so I think it’s important because we now have amazing resources – you being one of them – to say, ——



— “This is how the U2 thing was done, and this is what it was really about.”

Not only that, but we are not getting the clear news today, even though all of the information is available. This is what the Kennedy assassination and the Vietnam War was really about. This is what Iran-Contra was about, and this is how it was done.

Then you start to realize that it gives you a map to know that when they tell you that there were four war games going on at the time of 9/11, so they had confusion about what the real planes were and what the hijacked planes were, and those war games included hijacked planes, you understand that the *Secret Team* is hard at work.

Fitts: It’s very interesting. We have been going through a long process on the missing money of \$21 trillion where we had what is supposed to be a good investigative reporter spend a year, write a story, and after it is all said and done, the whole effort is to try to persuade people that it’s not \$21 trillion but \$100 billion.

So you make the story go away by lowering the number. \$21 trillion is enough money to build a separate civilization; \$100 billion is not.

You make it a \$100 billion story, and you bring it back to, “Oh, it’s poorly managed,” or, “It’s out of control, and there is some correction going on.”



Blazer: Keep Fitts out of the story as much as possible. You know all of the background stuff about where they basically have tried to pull the wool over people's eyes using the *Nation* magazine, which has some prestige and so on. That is very, very typical of the way the *Secret Team* or the Deep State works.

Fitts: And they are good. They are very good. This one was brilliantly done.

If you look at the guys who they used to sit on me the last couple of times, they used the same guys. They keep recycling them out.

Blazer: It's like what Prouty says. He would show up for another op, and they would say, "Oh, you're here on this? You were just in Guatemala. You're in the Philippines, too?"

It's a small community, and it's the same guys doing a lot of the stuff.

Fitts: I think that their Achilles' heel is the money.

Blazer: We always felt that it was the money and the sex. They use both of them as weapons, but it's also their Achilles' heel. That is one of the reasons why they are trying to pin all of the pedophilia on the Vatican. It's an out for them.

We've done a lot. How do we summarize this? We don't want to go on and on at this point.



Fitts: The way that I would summarize it is that there is a Deep State, and it's helpful to you to understand who and what the Deep State is. There is a lot of disinformation bopping around, but also if we are going into the kind of change that I think we are going into, including reengineering the US government mechanisms, you and I did a great show on Amazon. They just plopped their headquarters with one next to the Treasury and one next to the New York Fed – what a surprise! I think that a lot of the cash flow is there.

Blazer: One could argue that it involves the CIA, too.

Fitts: Right. I think it's important that people have the immune system they need to protect themselves from the disinformation and the framework to watch the reengineering in a way that helps them understand how in their day-to-day life they need to bob and weave and duck and manage.

Blazer: The way that I would phrase it is exactly what you are saying, but I would add that the Constitution is built on you being innocent before proven guilty. Any time that you look at a news report that comes out of this compromised media, you should assume that they are guilty, and give them the burden to prove their innocence.

In other words, it is disinformation until proven otherwise. That is the way that you need to look at it. That is how contaminated it is. That is how compromised the fourth estate is. Then just realize that the enforcement arm for all of this and the facilitator for all of this is the fifth arm that is the covert world that we describe as the Deep State and Secret State and the *Secret Team*, which we can go into a lot of detail about now given the research that has been done —



— about very specific events that will give you a map about exactly how they do things. It doesn't always tell you who it is, and sometimes it does, but it certainly tells you how, and sometimes it tells you why.

Fitts: If somebody wants to really deep dive this, read Prouty's books and read the three books that we gave you on the Kennedy assassination.

Blazer: We will have some other sources put up like Peter Dale Scott.

Fitts: Peter Dale Scott has done great work on the Deep State.

Blazer: There is tons and tons of information, but we are going to try to get it down to a few things that you can go to. Hopefully if you have any doubts about this stuff, it will put you into the right frame of mind to know what happened.

Fitts: The last thing that I want to say is that it is very important to understand that the Deep State is not something that is in someplace else. It networks into every family, every phone, and every smart meter.

Blazer: It used to be the 3,000 communities (county level). Now it is basically at an individual level.

Fitts: Right, but they still control the mechanisms of the county. If you look at the pots of money, they manage the pots of money and taxes and all of the governmental stuff one county at a time, and it rolls up in the counties. That is why I keep telling people that they had better pay attention to their local elections.



Blazer: What you are trying to say is that the control mechanism, because of data, is able to go down to the individual level. Previously the major control mechanism and sub-mechanism was at the county level, because it required people and it was a political mechanism.

Fitts: Right. The Deep State is in your house, it is in your city hall, it is in your local courthouse, and it is everywhere. That is why I call it ‘spiritual warfare’. We are dealing with this 24/7 every day. They’ve got a software bot on everybody. It’s not something ‘out there’. Part of seeing it in your life is being able to bring it down to the local level.

I am with you. Start with Prouty and start with the Kennedy assassination. There are a bunch of good movies. Start with the JFK movie. Start to see the Deep State as it operates through your day-to-day life in a way that can help you live your free and inspired life. You need to know when to duck.

Blazer: And assume that it is misinformation until proven otherwise.

Fitts: Exactly. Thank you. Ladies and gentlemen, thank you for joining us on The Solari Report. May I close with a statement I always make? “Don’t worry about whether or not there is a conspiracy. If you’re not in a conspiracy, you need to start one.”
